STRONG AUSSIE DOLLAR REDUCES THE PRICE OF KIRPY ROCK CRUSHERS

The continued strength of the Australian Dollar against the Euro has allowed international compaction and crushing specialists Broons to substantially reduce the price of Kirpy Rock Crushers to its Australasian customers.

"We're always keen to make sure our customers get the best value possible so we're passing on the savings that we have been able to make with the favourable variation to currency exchange rates," said Director Stuart Bowes.

"There's never been a better time to buy a Kirpy Rock Crusher but I'm not sure how long we'll be able to hold the revised prices as this will be determined by the fluctuations in the currency market. Over the last few years, all we've seen is price rises due to cost increases in steel and labour but the GFC has hit the Euro-zone particularly hard and we're reaping the benefit here in Australia."

"At the moment we can offer savings of around \$10,000 on the BPB 250 and WX 300 Kirpy crushers, which pretty well wipes out the increases we've had to pass on the last 3-4 years." Stuart said.

Broons are the Australasian distributors for the Kirpy range of Rock Crushing equipment made in France. Three models - the BPB 200, the BPB 250 and the larger WX 300 - are available for hire or purchase and are well suited to road construction, while other models are available for agricultural applications.

The toughened carbide-tipped hammers crush rock between 300mm and 400mm in diameter into 40mm minus product at a rate up to 200m³ an hour. Simply connected to a tractor with a constantly variable transmission (or creeper gear) through its three-point linkage and PTO drive means the Kirpy crusher is OH&S friendly and the operator can be crushing within minutes of arriving at the site.

Council Works Managers and operators that have used Kirpy rock crushers have been impressed by their durability, quality and simple dual poly V-belt drive. Sealed bearings and a hydraulically adjustable anvil featuring a hydro-pneumatic safety device make these machines the best performers for their size in the Australian market.
